

# Personal Pronouns

With **Present Simple** only, designed especially for level **Elementary** students

Subject pronoun	Object pronoun	Possessive adjective	Possessive pronoun	Reflexive pronoun
I	me	my	mine	myself
You	you	your	yours	yourself/yourselfs
We	us	our	ours	ourselves
They	them	their	theirs	themselves
He	him	his	his	himself
She	her	her	hers	herself
It	it	its	its	itself

### Examples of usage

<b>You</b> know my sister. <b>She</b> is here.	Give <b>me</b> a red pen, please.	It is <b>our</b> son Jack and <b>his</b> friend Tom.	This idea is <b>mine</b> and that one – <b>hers</b> .	I need you to do it <b>yourself</b> .
